

Unveiling of our "CogWall"

Woodstock Hospital installs innovative interactive wall for patients

Woodstock Hospital is home to the first interactive wall on a hospital inpatient unit in the South West LHIN. The new interactive wall is meant to stimulate a patient's cognition, so has been named the "CogWall."

The CogWall is the result of a partnership between the hospital and Fanshawe College and is designed to engage and stimulate patients with memory impairments during their admission to the hospital and aims to decrease both physical and cognitive decline. The CogWall is located on the Complex Continuing Care unit (2100) in the hospital. Patients admitted to this unit are often older adults with complex medical and intellectual needs and can remain in hospital for long periods of time.

"We are very proud of this innovation, which will give our patient's an opportunity to recall experiences and senses that they would in their day to day lives at home," explains Sherry McKnight, Director of Patient Care, Inpatient Rehabilitation and Complex Care.

The CogWall was developed through a partnership with Fanshawe College. A dedicated team of students brought the ideas to life, creating a design that allows the patient to independently approach one of four modules. Each module is themed with background pictures, such as a 1950's kitchen, and intended to encourage the patient to reminisce about the images they might normally interact with.

"The CogWall was purposely constructed so that patients with poor memory could still feel successful during interaction with the modules," states Michelle Worsfold, Director of Mental Health Services. "Patients can 'steer' the tractor through a wheat field on a screen, or 'answer' the rotary phone that is preprogrammed to ring at intervals and listen to a recorded general message. Hospital volunteers and family members may even be involved by leaving 'mail' in the mailbox."

Woodstock Hospital is committed to providing a compassionate and caring experience for patients. Innovative projects such as the CogWall are an example of how the hospital is meeting the needs of patients and their families and striving to improve patient outcomes.
