The HART Hub will provide evidence-based, multifaceted programs and services that address locally identified needs and will provide the appropriate services along the HART Hub client's journey. As part of the Oxford HART Hub model, Woodstock Hospital has purchased a building intended to focus on the support, stability, and recovery components of the client's journey. After a thorough review of potential sites, 16 Graham Street, the former PUC building in Woodstock, was selected for its proximity to the downtown core, which makes services accessible. This location is also close to many community service providers. These partnerships will be crucial in delivering an integrated care approach to help clients achieve long-term stability.

With today's announcement, we are one step closer to having this vital resource to serve residents in Woodstock and Oxford County.
